Transferring Dual Credit

Two options to see if your dual credit classes will transfer.

1. The College/University Transfer Equivalency Guide

DC transfer guide that can be used for both in state and out of state schools:

Conduct a google search for the College/University transfer equivalency guide. Using a google search type in the university you plan to attend with transfer equivalency guide.

Example "Texas A&M University transfer equivalency guide"

Using the College/University transfer equivalency guide key in Lone Star College course numbers to see which courses transfer to that College/University.

Note: The College/University course numbers may differ from the Lone Star College course numbers. Locate the degree plan you intend to study from the College/University you will attend to verify the courses needed in the degree plan. The easiest way to look up a College/University degree plan is a google search. In the google search bar place the degree you are planning to complete as well as the institution that you will attend.

Example "Mechanical Engineering Degree Plan at Texas A&M University".

Please be aware that every College/University may not have an online transfer equivalency guide. If the school you plan to attend does not have a transfer equivalency guide, another option is to call the College/University admission office and request to speak to a transcript evaluator. The transcript evaluator will be able to answer question regarding transfer credit to their campus from Lone Star College.

2. Texas Common Core Numbering System

Note: The college/universities course numbers may differ from the Lone Star College course numbers. To see which classes transfer to the College/University you plan to attend and count towards your degree plan. First locate the degree plan online that you will study next search Texas Common Core web-site (www.tccns.org).

Need help locating a degree plan the easiest way to look up a college/university degree plan is a google search. In the google search place the degree you are planning to complete as well as the institution that you will attend.
